

## Steps to Becoming a Volunteer Coach

Complete all steps below to become a HeatSmart Alliance coach:

- 1. Become an Individual Member or Associate of the Alliance. See more information and instructions at <a href="https://heatsmartalliance.org/engage-with-us-for-individuals/">https://heatsmartalliance.org/engage-with-us-for-individuals/</a>.
- 2. Read the following general information about various types of heat pumps:
  - Information published by the Massachusetts Clean Energy Center (MassCEC) on its <u>Clean Energy Lives Here</u> website, in particular the following documents
    - <u>Guide to Air Source Heat Pumps</u> (ASHP)
    - <u>Guide to Ground Source Heat Pumps</u> (GSHP)
    - <u>Guide to Heat Pump Water Heaters</u> (HPWH)
  - <u>Air Source Heat Pump Buying Guide</u> published by NEEP.org
- 3. Learn about locale-specific incentive programs, including rebates, incentives and tax credits available to members of your community:

For coaches residing in communities served by Investor Owned Utilities (IOUs) including Eversource and National Grid:

- Mass Save Electric Heating and Cooling Equipment
- Mass Save Electric Heat Pump Water Heaters
- Mass Save also provides rebates for <u>oil</u>, <u>propane</u>, and <u>gas</u> heating systems since central heat pumps are often installed in conjunction with replacing an existing fossil-fuel heating system.
- MassCEC Whole Home ASHP Pilot Program, running through June 25, 2021.

For coaches residing in a community served by a municipal light plant (MLP), visit your MLP's web site to learn about incentive programs they may offer.

For residents of all Massachusetts communities:

- Federal Tax Credits: Various credits are available for home energy efficiency improvements; see <u>EnergyStar overview of federal tax credits</u>
- 4. **Read the HeatSmart Alliance Coaching Model**. Download the complete model from <u>https://heatsmartalliance.org/coaching-model/</u> and review all four components.



- 5. **Review Client-Facing Materials** that coaches send to prospective clients and ask them to complete at the start of an engagement:
  - Homeowner Questionnaire
  - Liability Waiver
- 6. Complete the Knowledge and Skills Self-Assessment via our <u>on-line self-assessment</u> form.
- Write a personal Coaching Statement. You will share this statement with prospective clients. Example coach's statements are available on the HeatSmart Alliance Google Drive -- search on "Example Coaching Statements". Note: you must be a Member or Associate to access our shared Google Drive.
- 8. Submit your New Coach Application via our on-line application form.

That's it! Our Coaching Panel will review the information you submit and assign a mentor within two weeks. You will receive a notification that you can represent yourself as a HeatSmart Alliance Volunteer Coach and contact info for your mentor. Your mentor can help you start promoting your services and will be available for consultations as you begin helping clients.
